Creedmoor School Plan Changed


On March 26 local civics joined together to oppose a plan to place three schools for 2,550 students on ten acres of surplus Creedmoor Psychiatric Center property. Thanks to the quick intervention of State Senator Frank Padavan as well as Assemblyman Mark Weprin and Board of Education member for Queens Terri Thomson the plan was expanded to place the three schools on 32 acres as originally proposed by the Queens Civic Congress Master Plan drafted by several local civics, including the BCCA.

The potential community impact of the 10 acre plan would have been devastating for Glen Oaks and Bellerose. It must be noted that the Glen Oaks

residents packed the rally and spoke in strong opposition to the 32 acre plan, objecting that their community will be impacted by large groups of students wandering around the area.

The Queens Civic Congress and BCCA agree that it is not ideal for the Glen Oaks neighborhood. We also recognize the severed lack of schools in Queens. And we are quite excited about the possibility of a top notch educational campus serving local youth from pre-K through high school.

While many details have to be worked out, the deal seems solid, including adequate playground space, parking, bus

Police Report

The following is courtesy of the 105th Precinct Community Council.

Numerous groups are actively soliciting donations under the guise of "Police Department" affiliation. These groups, seeking to exploit the community's desire to support the police, often use the word Police or similar terminology in their titles. Additionally, their representatives are giving the impression that they are in some way associated with the New York City Police Department.

As an incentive for your donation they are offering items such as: official police decals, identi-

fication cards or advertising space in police journals. These groups claim that these incentive items will afford you favorable treatment from police officials. Some of these groups shamefully claim that portions of the donations received provide assistance to the widows and orphans of Police Officers killed in the line of duty. These groups misrepresent their relationship to the N.Y.P.D. and most of the donated money goes to administrative associated operations costs. If you are solicited by such a group, record as much information as you can, contact the 24 hour NYPD Internal Affairs office at (212) 741-8401. Information received will be added to the list monitored and investigated by the NYPD.
