Councilman Grodenchik

The primary season has finished and Election Day is a becoming a memory. Our district had one of the most visible elections in the city during this off-year election due to the exit of Mark Weprin from our Council seat. After a tough election battle with Joseph Concannon, Barry Grodenchik won. BCCA wishes Councilman Grodenchik a very successful term.

Barry came to BCCA's 80th Anniversary Luncheon (see photos inside) to congratulate us and to assure us of his support in dealing with city agencies and getting budget funds, particularly for the Bellerose Playground.

Barry said "my new favorite project is PS133" playground. One of his first stops was to PS133 but was unimpressed. He said it is "a sad looking park, very dated." He had already spoken to the School Construction Authority, which is responsible for the reconstruction, and learned that an additional \$800,000 is necessary on top of already available funds, but he promised "not to let the children of this district be hostage to budget." Barry is scheduling a meeting with the borough Parks commissioner soon and promised that the playground's "final result will be spectacular." BCCA will follow this very closely and keep you posted.

Important Community Resources

Community Board 13—Community Boards are important resources throughout the city for all of our residents and neighborhoods. Our area is in Queens Community Board 13, which has its office at 219-41 Jamaica Avenue and can be reached at 718-464-9700. The 59 community boards, including 14 in Queens are each comprised of up to fifty citizens who advise city government on issues and budgets in their areas. Each has an office staffed by full time city employees who can take questions and complaints and contact agencies, officials and council members to resolve local problems.

CB offices are under the leadership of the board and direct supervision of its hired district manager. CB13 recently hired Mark McMillan as District Manager. Mark is an attorney and has many years of high level experience at the Queens Borough President's office. You are encouraged to contact Mark at the above number if you have questions or problems with city services.

105th Precinct Community Council-Our precinct has a very active council that meets monthly at the precinct on the fourth Wednesday at 8pm. The commanding officer, community affairs and crime prevention officers are there to take crime complaints and update trends and stats. Open to all.

Beware—Speed Cameras Nearby

Some local folks have learned by experience that the City has recently followed through on its Vision Zero with a speed limit reduction on local streets and installation of speed cameras. The speed limit throughout the city is now 25 miles per hour (MPH), a significant reduction. Cameras are now located and prominently marked on Hillside Avenue near Martin Van Buren and on Union Turnpike. Friends have reported that they have been shocked to receive tickets in the mail for speeds as low as 32 MPH.

Driving at 25 MPH seems like walking speed, especially while other drivers beep and change lanes to pass you. We suggest you "stand your ground," avoid temptation and avoid a ticket! Maintain the 25 MPH rule. Nassau County speed limit has not changed, so you can speed up at the border.

Assemblyman Weprin Annual Holiday Toy Drive
