Many of your requests and complaints have been forwarded to the various City and State Agencies having jurisdiction. Hopefully, corrective action will be forthcoming. we will continue to press the needs of our community. Please contact any of your Association Officers, board members or block captains with suggestions.

Some very important decision will be made shortly regarding land use and zoning for large tracts of vacant land in our area. These are the Creedmoor Spur property owned by the New York State Department of Transportation and 58 acres on the Creedmoor State Hospital site which the State Department of Mental Hygiene plans to dispose of. we will represent the wishes of our community to maintain the residential character of the area, and support zoning changes which will insure this position.

we have been advised that bids for the Bellerose Branch Library at 250th Street and Hillside Avenue will be opened in December and construction will start in March of 1974.

Reconstruction of Little Neck Parkway is scheduled to start early next spring. The program includes a center landscaped mall which will greatly enhance the natural beauty of our community.

Our Association has gotten off to an exciting new start and I am sure we will become even more dynamic in the years to come. I would like to thank all of you who have made the reactivation of the Bellerose Commonwealth Civic Association such a huge success. Also, I urge any of you who have not joined us in our common cause for a better more responsive community to attend our next meeting, become informed and be involved in your Association.
