June Walk Set for June 15th


With more than 200 children expected to participate. the B.C.C.A. "June Walk" on Saturday. June 15. promises to be a spectacular event. The costume parade will begin at 2:00 PM at the P.S. 133 playground.

The paraders, led by the drum and bugle corps of Our Lady of Snows, will proceed along 85 Ave. to 253 St. then along 253 St. to 87 Ave. 87 Ave. to 249 St., ending at the playground.

After the parade there will be a short Flag Day ceremony followed by ice cream, soda and other refreshments. Prizes will be awarded for the best decorated carriages, hicycles and wagons or floats.

Our Community is just a signature away from getting our "surplus" Creedmoor land bill (thanks to Senator Padavan and Assemblyman Esposito) into law. The bill would authorize the State of N.Y. to convey to Triumph (The Remedy for Infinite Unconcern for Mentally and Physically Handicapped. Inc.) a non-profit voluntary agency, the much publicized 6.638 acres of "surplus Creedmoor Land". The remaining 52 acres of land would be used as a "tree farm", which would preclude high-rise construction on the property, something the residents of Queens now have in abundance. Assemblyman Esposito said, "the tract is the last large piece of farm land in NYC and offers an excellent opportunity not only to preserve what little is left of the rural atmosphere in Eastern Queens, but would provide the Parks Dept. with a readily available supply of street trees and shrubbery for use in its landscapping program."

In closing, our Queens Village, Hollis, Bellerose Voluntary Ambulance Corp. needs our financial support. Please be generous for this much needed "free" service to our Community.
