JUNE WALK

On June 12th at 2PM (June 19th raindate) we will be holding our annual June Walk. The event, which commemorates Flag Day, is a children's costume parade, and will be led by the St. Anastasia Fife, Drum and Bugle Corps. The parade route will be the same as last year: starting at 249th Street and 85th Avenue, west on 85th Avenue to Commonwealth Blvd.; south on Commonwealth to 87th Drive; east on 87th Drive to 254th Street; north on 254th Street to 86th Avenue; west on 86th Avenue to 251st Street; north on 251st Street to 85th Avenue; and west on 85th Avenue to 249th Street. If you live along the parade route, please park your car in the driveway. All Bellerose residents are requested to display their American Flags.

After the parade there will be refreshments at the P.S. 133 ballfield, followed by the judging of costumes, carriages and floats. We request children do not bring bicycles.

Several prizes have already been received, including two tickets to Yankee Stadium.

We are hoping for a large turnout at our community affair. Please come and urge your neighbors to do the same.

BARBARA CARTLAND

"Gliding smoothly toward me came a vision of pink, white fur muff holding jeweled hands, as the velvet coat fell gracefully at her sides." Sound like an excerpt from a novel? It is a description of Miss Barbara Cartland, who has been proclaimed by the Guinness Book of Records at the world's bestselling authoress, as she made a guest appearance at Genovese (a typical American) Drug Store in New Hyde Park to promote her new line of fragrances by Helena Rubinstein. The Three scents for sale are reminiscent of her famous novels --both in title and description: "Moments of Love" (Like a lover's kiss, it's magically alluring); "The Heart Triumphant" (lingers like the touch of his kiss) and "Love Wins" (and the dream becomes a reality)--this last also the title of

her most recent book. President of the National Association for Health in England, which she helped form, she is an avid campaigner for the use of vitamins to "keep well and look really lovely," claiming sedatives and aspirin dull the brain.

Charming, vigorous and regal, Miss Cartland was 80 last July and keeps to a schedule of travel and guest appearances that would leave even a much younger person breathless. Each place she travels to becomes the setting for a romantic novel in which she is always the heroine and the man she wants to meet is the hero soon to be discovered. She disclosed it takes seven days of writing to complete a book, after extensive research and the help of reference books. Over 200 million copies of her 321 novels have been sold worldwide in 19 languages.

It was exhilarating to meet this elegant British Dame whose zest for living and own life experiences read like a novel. She was gracious and friendly to her awed fans who did not hesitate to tell of their unabashed acceptance of her entertaining books. To paraphrase her titles, I was "Bewitched" and "Enchanted" listening to this celebrity I thought so "Out of Reach," and slipped away with "Stars in My Heart."

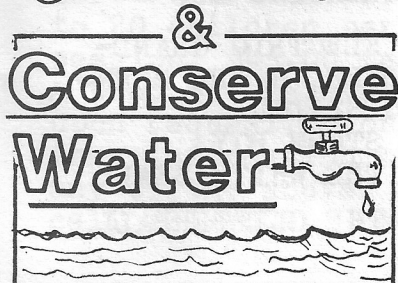

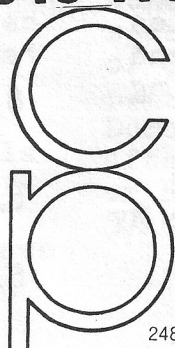
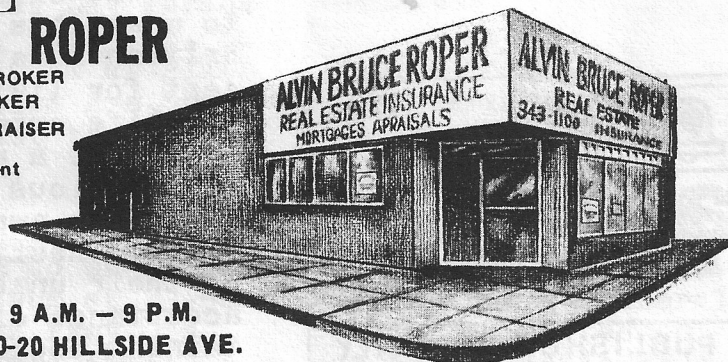
