Prizes will be awarded for various age groups. Create your own costume, build a small float, decorate your bikes and join the parade.



During the past month we signed the contract with the City for our Operation Identification equipment. Hope to have more to report at the next meeting.


I have attended several meetings of the 105th Community Council concerning the youth problems. Unfortunately the parents who are the ones the police hope to reach do not attend.
