The Operation Identification tool is available to all members of the community. Those who haven't taken advantage of this program in the past are urged to do so now. Either contact your block captain or sign up for the tool at the next meeting. The darm system is also available and waiting for your use. You can use the alarms for winter vacations as well as long weekends.

Leaving your windows open while you take 30 minutes to go to the store gives the burglar 20 minutes to get into your home. Keeping excessive cash, jewelry and bonds at home makes the burglary that more costly to the homeowner. Use safety deposit boxes for these items.

There are various simple ways a homeowner can install a small alarm on the garage door to cause noise to scare the thief away.
