Bellerose Library Announcement

Jennifer Manley representing Queensborough Public Library (QPL) reported to a full house of the Bellerose Commonwealth Civic Association that a fund of nearly \$1.5 million has been pulled together for a major upgrade of the Bellerose Library branch. Electronic self-check-in and check-out, new computers, new furniture, badly needed building improvements including repairing exterior cracks and roof leaks and designated adult and youth areas are included. Work is expected to start in late spring and take about six months. With lots some luck it will be complete by year end. A temporary location will be set up for continued use. Jennifer also reported on QPL plans for lending e-books and other electronic downloads.

Special recognition for pulling this fund together goes to Councilman Mark Weprin for \$600,000 for technology improvements, \$150,000 for Senator Tony Avella and to Assemblywoman Barbara Clark for \$100,000 for general improvements to the library. And thanks also go to Queens Public Library for matching these funds. We look forward to a significant refurbishment in 2012.

Redistricting—Bellerose Area Unites

Once every 10 years, after the decennial census, our state legislative districts are reviewed and changed based on population. Occasionally this redistricting is influenced by politics and in the past has not served the need to keep communities together and whole. Over the past several months several civic associations in the Bellerose/Floral Park area have banded together to work on several issues of mutual concern. The civic associations have gotten together to establish Eastern Queens United. At a recent meeting of the group it was decided to put up a significant fight to keep the Bellerose Floral Park area together in any future redistricting and to take several actions to make sure that this happens. A rally has been scheduled on January 12, 2012 at 7pm in the Queens High School of Teaching at the Padavan School Campus on Union Turnpike and Commonwealth Blvd in Bellerose to bring together area residents to demand that Bellerose, Floral Park, Glen Oaks be kept together in one Senate, Assembly and Congressional districts.

This is extremely important as we all have similar needs, concerns and issues and can best be handled if we are united as our groups have been. To separate us in different districts would weaken us. Please make your calendar and join us on January 12 to call the redistricting committees to keep us together. A large turnout is needed to make our point strongly and effectively.

BCCA Joins Local Civics To Bring Truth to the ICCC Claims

You will recall that the Indian Cultural and Community Center (ICCC), a group affiliated with the Indian Orthodox Church, has purchased property on Creedmoor and despite early plans for a community center and athletic field, has decided to build two nine-story apartment buildings. The Bellerose area civics once again united to fight this plan that would create buildings out of scale and character with our low-density community. The project is now on hold while investigations by the State Inspector General and Attorney General review irregularities in the state sale of the land. While these reviews go on, the civics have remained quiet—but the ICCC has not. In letters to the editors of several Queens weekly papers the ICCC made several false claims about their project and accusations against to community opposition. You may recall that Community Board 13Q opposed ICCC's variance request by a vote of 22 against, one in favor and one abstention following the delivery of over 2,200 letters protesting the project from local community residents. The BCCA joined with six other local civics to publish a lengthy and thorough point-by-point repudiation of numerous false claims in a full page ad (copies available at January meeting). In addition, it was recently revealed that a NYS Supreme Court judge has vindicated our claims by demanding that the ICCC turn over its files to the state Inspector General with regard to the purchase and investments by members of their community (press release copies at meeting). We do not believe any final action will be taken on the variance application until the two investigations are concluded.

Queens Civic Congress Installs New Officers

BCCA has been a member of the Queens Civic Congress, an umbrella group of over 110 civic associations representing all of Queens, from its inception in 1995. We are proud to report that Richard Hellenbrecht of the BCCA was inducted on December 11 as the fourth president of the borough-wide group. Richard was Executive Vice President and became president following the tragic car accident that killed Patricia Dolan. We wish Richard luck in this new role and hope he still has time for the BCCA.

Trees

For two years we have been requesting two trees for the empty tree pits inside the Bellerose playground. We recently received the trees, but some lower branches have already been broken. We also received some new street trees in our area. You may remember the "Arborcide" last August after hurricane Irene. The street trees were intentionally cut down in front of the Bazaar market on Hillside Avenue, which will replace the old Fine Fair supermarket. The trees were just replaced by the City.
