UPDATE : SENIOR CITIZEN PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION

The income limit for Senior Citizen Property Tax Exemption is \$ 8000.00/year at the present time. Last year, the N.Y. State Legislature passed two Bills, raising the income limit and also starting a new graduated partial reduction above the limit, instead of a sharp cut-off. Under Home Rule it would not apply in N.Y.C. without a corresponding Bill being passed by the City Council.

Intro. No. 660 was introduced in the City Council on 9/27/83. Council Member Sheldon Leffler co-sponsored the Bill, which was reffered to the Committee on Finance. The newspapers and TV did not report this story.

The new income limit would be \$ 10500.00 for the 50 °/.
exemption. For each additional \$ 500.00 income, 5 °/. steps down are provided ending at 20 °/. EXEMPTION for incomes of \$ 13000.00 or more, but less than \$ 13500.00.


LOVE THY NEIGHBOR


