We were very happy to hear our Community Patrol representative report on crime in our neighborhood at the B.C.C.A. November meeting. He was unable to think of any particular noteable criminal activity. That was satisfying.

According to statistics released by the 105th precinct, for the July through October 1999 period, the Bellerose section recorded felony crimes totaling 30, 27, 22 and 22 per month. This included one murder, 31 auto thefts and 26 burglaries.


