

Glen Oaks Campus Public Hearings

The School Construction Authority recently held public hearings to receive comment on the current plan to put three schools on the Creedmoor property on the Northwest side of Commonwealth Blvd at Union Turnpike.

As presented, the Board of Education now plans to put two pre-K to Eight grade PS/IS schools and one High School. The PS/IS schools will be part of the Chancellors District and receive children primarily from District 26 (ours) and 29 (to the south.) The High School will be for students borough-wide who are interested in pursuing teaching careers. All told there will be over 2,850 students.

The entrance will be on Union Tpke west of Commonwealth Boulevard

leading to a long driveway and parking lot.

Community Board 13Q discussed this proposal and prepared a resolution seeking further traffic study of this plan to make sure there will be no traffic impacts. The Board also asked SCA to report back on its plans for public transportation since there is only one bus line serving the area. Also, since approximately 13 acres of the 33 acre site is unplanned, CB13 asked to restrict this space to educational facilities and to work with the Board as soon as plans are developed. The Queens Civic Congress and local civics also expressed concern over these issues.

Winchester Homes

Anyone driving down Hillside Avenue near Winchester Boulevard will be shocked to see that all of the trees in the western corner of Creedmoor property have been removed. This is the 8 abandoned acres that were sold by New York State last year that will be cleared to make way for "Alley Pointe" homes by Beechwood Homes developer (see site beechwoodhomes.com). Several townhouse style houses will be build there and sold for around \$325, 000 each. The rendering looks guite attractive and the house styles are nice, but the barren property looks really weird right now.
