#### Toy Ideas for the BCCA Toy Drive Toys Needed November 28 through December 16

Please remember that only new, unwrapped items can be accepted. Your support is greatly appreciated! Some suggestions for children in different age groups are:

**Infants/toddlers** -- Rattles and squeeze toys, musical toys or mobiles, unbreakable baby mirrors, crib toys picture books, stacking toys, dolls, large cars and trucks, teething toys, sippy cups.

**Pre-schoolers** –Building toys (large Legos, blocks), cars and trucks, dolls and doll clothes, puzzles, puppets, books, crayons, markers, coloring books, bubbles, Play-Doh, music-making toys, story and song tapes, stickers, Etch-a-Sketch, new stuffed animals, simple board games.

**School age Children** – Craft sets, stickers, Nerf toys, playing cards, hand-held games, dolls and doll clothes, matchbox cars, books and comic books, jigsaw puzzles, action figures, collectibles (rock collection, magnets, sports collectibles), board games, activity books (connect dots, crosswords, word Search), building kits (Legos, Tinker Toys, Lincoln Logs). **Gifts to Avoid** – Used toys and used stuffed animals, toys stuffed with shredded foam, small pellets or beans, toys with detachable parts (like button eyes) that could be removed and swallowed or inhaled, electrical, spark-producing or friction-producing toys, fragile toys that can break into small pieces with sharp edges, toys made of glass or brittle plastic, toys with sharp edges or protrusions, toys or craft kits toxic paints or glues, toys with parts that can pinch fingers or pull hair, toy guns and other violent toys.

#### Jamaica to Jericho Strip of avenue renamed to help cut confusion

It's official, much to the delight of Bellerose residents: Jamaica Avenue is now Jericho Turnpike. At a ceremony, City Councilman David Weprin, who led the drive for the name change, unveiled the new street sign. The legislation was introduced in May and called for changing the name from the Cross Island Parkway, at 245th Street, to 257th Street. The name change should make it easier for merchants to do business since all the street addresses will now be listed as on the turnpike. Community Board 13 Chairman Richard Hellenbrecht believes the name change will help strengthen the business strip by alleviating confusion to shoppers and visitors.
