CHANGED PLANS FOR LITTLE NECK PKWY

The New York City
Bureau of Traffic Operations, responding to
community requests,
performed a field study
of Little Neck Pkwy.
and held several meetings with representatives of the community.

Despite reports by our members of numerous accidents on Little Neck Pkwy. at 87th Ave.. Assistant Commissioner Hochstein stated that the installation of a traffic signal is not warranted at the present time and no immediate action is planned. However, a traffic signal will be installed at Little Neck and 83rd Ave. because studies indicated that it "may be of value in reducing accident hazards and accident potential".

Directional signs will be installed for traffic wishing to turn right on Hillside Ave., and left turn signals will be installed for exclusive left turn movements from Little Neck Pkwy. onto Hillside.

A review of the malls indicates that the present design is the most efficient design for the movement of traffic and for the safety of both vehicles and pedestrians.

To remind everyone that the speed limit on Little Neck is 30 MPH, new signs will be installed.

ANNUAL REASSESSMENT

Each year between
February 1st and
March 15th the N.Y.C.
Bureau of Real Property
Assessment publishes
its tentative assessment roll. If your
property taxes are paid
by the bank that holds
your mortgage, the bank
may be notified of the
new assessment rather
than the owner.

You can ascertain the new assessed valuation by visiting the Real Property Assessment Bureau's Queens office at 90-27 Sutphin Blvd. in Jamaica. Also, a card request form can be obtained from the Real Property Assessment Bureau (telephone number 658-4626). Cards were distributed at our January meeting by Assemblyman John Esposito. Information such as the block and lot number and the name of the person to whom notices of increased assessed valuation are to be mailed must be filled in on the forms which must be returned to the Bureau. The Bureau will then mail a notice of the new assessed valuation between Feb. 1st and March 15th.

Protest applications can also be obtained from the Real Property Assessment Bureau. They must be filed between Feb. 1s and March 15th.


