TAXES ON THE RISE?

The Eastern Queens Community Council, an amalgam of 17 or so civic associations in this area, warns that real estate taxes will likely rise, especially in areas like ours unless we take time to write our mayor and City Council members to let them know our feelings and fears about damaging tax hikes.

Many of us already have tough times meeting the high costs of living in the city and we are particularly disturbed about the lack of services and threats of further cutbacks. Senior citizens on fixed incomes and newer resi-

dents with especially high financing costs will be most affected by tax hikes and some may be forced to sell their houses and move elsewhere to make ends meet. Commuters have recently been hit by 15% increases in traveling costs and oil prices have gone through the roof due to an unseasonable December. However, the LIRR and subway service have been especially bad since the increases, and an unseasonably warm January has not returned oil prices to the norm.

We need to act to keep our neighborhood stable and property values high. Please write to Councilman Leffler and Mayor Dinkins to keep taxes at their current levels and improve serv-
