Meetings

At the December meeting we concluded the election of officers with the exception of a Treasurer and Vice-President. In January we will inaugurate the officers and directors.

We heard an exceptional presentation from Arthur Kell of NYPIRG about Incineration vs. Recycling. Mr. Kell's organization strongly supports recycling and favors even stronger manda-

tory recycling measures than were recently enacted by City Council. There is serious concern on their part about air pollution affects, ozone depletion and disposal of ash if more incinerators are added in the area. In addition, NY State and Federal environmental agency tests show that the residual ash fails hazardous waste tests. Landfills are clearly in a capacity crisis with few feasible alternatives.

NYPIRG contends that en-

forced recycling will stimulate private industry to step in to reuse certain materials. Some have already stepped in. For example, crushed glass is being used in paving materials, called "glasphalt" and insulation firms are working with fast food companies to repackage styrofoam for useful purposes. Plastics do not deteriorate over time as paper packaging does, so innovative re-uses of plastics is a high priority.

Youth Problems

At Community Board 13's meeting recently we heard of an incident which occurred early in November in North Bellerose in which a lone teenager was attacked by a large group of teens arriving by car. Its a phenomena which occurs quite frequently from Whitestone to Flushing, but this is the first time its happened locally. The 105th Precinct has an officer assigned to the case and has gathered a lot of information on it. In the course of the investigation other unrelated incidents had been uncovered and are undergoing further review.

Be aware that there are some gang problems in the area and some individuals who routinely brutalize other kids. If your son comes home with a bruise, don't immediately believe his excuse. Many kids are too embarrassed to admit to being bullied or fear retribution if they report an incident. But we have to get to the bottom of this before the bullies really get dangerous.

Please feel confident to talk to the Precinct Community Relations Officer or the Community Board if you witness or hear of a problem.

St. Gregory's Senior Housing

I'm sure you remember St. Gregory's proposal to build a senior citizen building of 50 apartments on the "girl's playground" next to the rectory. I'm told that the Catholic Charities

coordinator has dismissed the parish Advisory Committee on the center because they've made a decision about the shape of the project. I've made two calls the Charities, but they haven't been returned. I understand they will propose to build ten two-family buildings on the lot near the rectory for qualifying middle in-

come seniors, totally within the restrictive new zoning which was confirmed in late June 1989.

Charities is also pursuing the Creedmore property suggested by Senator Padavan for fifty low income senior apartments in a similar project to that originally proposed at St. Gregory's.
