Auto Crimes

The most recent meeting of the 105th Precinct Community Council featured a special presentation by the City's deputy inspector in charge of auto theft crimes. I wanted to share some of his discussion with you since we have experienced a heavy auto theft rate in this area.

Last year 134,000 autos are stolen in the city, that's an increase of 12%. In the 105th

Pct. 3,200 cars will be stolen during 1990, valued at \$16 million. The inspector emphasized that the average claim on a car theft is \$5,200, which is paid by insurance companies, but ultimately paid by insurance consumers in higher insurance premiums.

Inspector said there are basically three types of theft: for parts - where chop shops take quick moving and very expensive major parts, joy rides - taken for a show-off ride or transportation, usually recovered with little loss, and; theft on order, usually high demand cars - either domestic sale or for export. Off the road vehicles are in very high demand for export. Huge freight containers are used to move these high priced cars out of the country, with no chance of recovery. A separate category is insurance fraud, often by middle-class owners needing quick cash or tired of paying high repair bills. 25% of all claims are in frauds, costing the rest of us a bundle.

HEAT/Consumer's Advantage Inc. has been invited to speak at the February meeting. HEAT is an oil consumers' cooperative that uses the massive purchasing power of 10,000 active clients to wrestle deep discounts on oil purchases.

Presently, HEAT customers are paying \$1.11 vs \$1.41 paid for the same oil, from the same dealers by other customers. HEAT clients are assigned to one of 26 independent oil dealers, probably including the one you deal with now. Most of your current services are available from HEAT. For example, HEAT strongly encourages computer scheduled automatic delivery to avoid scams. Budget payment, or even-payment pro-

grams many of us rely on are available for the asking asare maintenance plans.

There are similar programs affiliated with unions or credit unions and other groups with varying advantages. On February 7 Richard Carlin will talk about the cooperative and answer any questions you may have. This appears to be a real bargain with no down side. Hold the date.


The good news is that the city has only recently realized the lost value due to car thefts and the serious impact on the quality of life. The police have taken an entirely new attitude to this serious crime. Anyone who has experienced a car theft in NY City knows the lack of attention, or concern expressed by officers.

Under the new program, CPOP officers will be trained to investigate auto thefts. Victims should expect the same attention received by victims of more personal crimes like burglary. You will be asked for the particulars. CPOP and patrol officers will follow up on the complaint, seeking any and all arrests.

The Inspector suggested some successful methods of prevention in the meantime. He recommended the now standard alarm and ignition cut-off systems, and strongly suggested the bars that connect the steering wheel to the brake pedal. Its not fool-proof, but it is a deterrent. CAT decals are also helpful.
