Burglaries on the Rise

We learned at the December meeting the there has been a spike in burglaries in Floral Park Queens. The police suspect that it is mostly youths because they are breaking in the front door or back door or breaking a rear window to get in. They also take only small items like cash and jewelry which is easy to carry and easy to "fence."

Since breaking into a door is the most frequent entry, Police suggest that the single best protection is to replace the screws in your door lock strike plate with 2-1/2 to 3 inch screws. Also, cut wooden blocks to fit

Illegal Conversions

All homeowners should know that the City Council is about to vote on a major bill, sponsored by Mayor Giuliani and Borough President Shulman. Introduction 363A is a multifacted bill that would increase financial and operational penalties for developers, contractors and landlords who illegally convert or sell illegal houses.

Some highlights are:

The buyer, seller and broker in a sale certify they are aware of the zoning restrictions and that there are no illegal apartments in the building. Vehicles and equipment of builders violating "stop work" orders can be seized. New building permits may be prohibited for builders with outstanding prior fines and penalties.


