fun there. Our festivities will begin at 12 Noon at PS 133 school yard.



Services Now for Adult Persons

The above-named organization started in 1978 when a concerned group of community people headed by Sam Camiller, who at the time headed the local chapter of American Association of Retired People meeting at Creedmoor Hospital, met at the House of Hope Presbyterian Church to try to obtain funding for a five day a week funded senior center which would meet the needs of the seniors of Bellerose, Queens Village, Floral Park and Glen Oaks. Proposals were made to the New York City Department of Aging indicating that our area was the only one in the whole city not serviced by such a senior center. The powers that be agreed to the need but could not meet it due to the financial state of the city at the time. Fortunately, one of our group represented the Lutheran Church which operates its own Life Insurance Company and plowed the profits back into the community.

A proposal was set up and a committee went to Appleton, Wisconsin on invitation of the insurance company to push our proposal. were awarded a grant of \$50,000 seed money to try to get our dream started. This money may seem like a lot but it barely covered the cost of a Director and Secretary so SNAP opened in 1979 manned mostly by dedicated volunteers.

page 3 The original funds were stretched to last two years when more funding started to come in. A van was purchased and that was the beginning of slow growth of the organization till last year it moved into St. Paul's Lutheran Church on Union Turnpike and 263 St. where Meals on Wheels and other services were dispensed. In July of 1986 it is anticipated that a full five day a week senior center will open with space for 150-200 member capacity and a fully funded staff.


