
Creedmoor School Plan Opposed At Rally on March 26

Local civics oppose the current plan of placing three schools for 2,500 students on ten acres of surplus Creedmoor Psychiatric Center property. The potential community impact of this plan can be devastating for Glen Oaks and Bellerose. Most importantly, the children for whom the schools are intended will be ill served by the school plan as presently constituted. The Queens Civic Congress (QCC) is hosting a rally against the school plan at Martin Van Buren High School on March 26 for 4:00 to 6:00 pm. Please mark your calendar and come down.

History: Over the last several years, the BCCA and other local civic asso-

ciations under the auspices of the QCC, have met with Borough President Shulman, the Board of Education and the Empire State Development Corporation to develop a master plan for the Creedmoor properties that are currently or will become surplus. The master plan was adopted and B.P. Shulman sent it to Governor Pataki over a vear ago.

Master Plan: Among other things, the master plan, required by Executive Order, demanded any development must respect current zoning, new buildings must use the footprint of the previous building and existing natural areas must be

maintained as is. The Task Force was aware of and supported a school proposal as part of the master plan. However, that plan included 26 acres for a three school educational park including natural areas and a high school with an environmental theme in con-

(Continued from page 1) cert with Alley Pond Environmental Center.

Education Site: The original 26 arcesite is located on Commonwealth Boulevard between Union Turnpike and the Grand Central Parkway. Includes 2 older, currently active buildings and a newer building that includes a swimming pool, theater, bowling alley and classrooms.

The Proposal: Unlike the proposal supported by our local civics, the current plan proffered by the Board of Education and supported by the Borough President

places the same three schools on the northerly 10 acres near the Grand Central.

The schools include a grammar school from kindergarten to fifth grade for our district (CSD26), an intermediate school (sixth grade

through ninth) for CSD29 (Queens Village to JFK Airport) and a high school for borough-wide students geared toward future teachers.


Educational Objections: Three schools would take up every inch of the 10 acre parcel, with no room for any playground or athletic space. Schools are governed by three different jurisdictions making coordi-

nation and accountability almost impossible. Children of vastly different ages would enter and exit through the same area, creating potential of fights, negative influences and available of drugs for

young children. Intermediate school children would have to change buses and take a very long trip. CSD29 students would be deprived of participating in extracurricular activities due to the trip. Parents from CSD29 are vehemently opposed to this as well.

Community Objections: Buses may be diverted through residential streets like Commonwealth Blvd. in our area. Beautiful trees and natural areas on the property would be destroyed. Intermediate school children from Glen Oaks and Bellerose, within walking distance, would be zoned to other, more distant schools. Increased traffic and congestion with teacher and student parking and drop-offs.

The Rally: We need a very good turnout at the rally on March 26 at Martin Van Buren. It is outrageous that some political objectives may cause such a bad plan to go forward. Be there! Even if you don't want to give testimony, your presence counts greatly.
