

It is time to clean up our gardens and lawns for the summer will be upon us before we know it.

Turn over your planting areas, but donot plant any vegetables until May 15th unless you are prepared to

place hot kaps over them at night. Our area still can have frost at night and in the morning, killing the seed- on planting and maintaining roof is now on, much lings.

You can plant lettuce seeds radishes, calarobi, carrots, and spinnach as they are cold weather seeds and will not be affected by frost.

Yourlawn care is very important now- rake of the dry grass and leaves, add lime to the lawn before the Second week in May.

Any areas that are bare scratch up and sprinkle grass seed liberaly, and tamp or roll flat. Keep the lawn moist until germination starts, then do not over water.

Cut grass when it grows to 3 inches tall/do not cut your grass too short at any time. As this will make the roots open to the rays of the sun which will burn them.

Do not water your grass in the Afternoon, each bead of water will act like a magnifying glass and burn your grass-do not water late at night either as then you will end up with a mould or fungus on your lawn. Water in the early morning before the sun gets to strong.
