The Health Systems
Agency (HSA) held its
first meeting of the
1979-80 year on Tuesday
evening Sept. 11, 1979
at the Jewish Institute
for Geriatric Care (JIGC).
It was an extremely interesting and dynamic
opening meeting.

The issue on hand concerned Mayor Koch's recent Task Force Proposal on the closings and mergers of certain underutilized proprietary and municipal hospitals. Guest speakers from Terrace Heights Hospital, Queens Hospital Center and Long Island Jewish were invited to District H's meeting.

The executive director of Terrace Heights Hospital spoke against Mayor Koch's proposal to close down the facility. He stated that Terrace Heights was a 127 bed medical-surgical facility located in Hollis. It is presently operating in the black, has deficient structure and code violations and is running only at a 84% capacity as of the first eight months of this fiscal vear.

The Task Force has also recommended a "merger" or a "management contract" of Long Island Jewish and Queens Hospital Center, instead of a complete closure of Queens Hospital Center (located in Jamaica). Speakers from Queens Hospital Center were Ms. Cathy Freeman, chairperson of Community Board at Queens Hospital Center

and Ms. Pollack. an employee at QHC. Both were very vocal and were against the possible "merger", or "take-over" of QHC by Long Island Jewish. QHC is presently a 711 bed medicalsurgical facility. The speakers expressed the fact that QHC presently serves a certain socioeconomical segment of t the population which would not be able to obtain adequate health care if the facility closed down. They all alledged that L.I.J. frequently used QHC as a "dumping" ground for certain indigent patients unable to pay.

Finally, representing L.I.J. was Mr. Markowitz who calmly defended each of the accusations made regarding L.I.J. He was against the word "take-over". On the "dumping" issue, he attempted to explain that 15% of their clinic patients were medicaid cases and that each and every patient brought to their Emergency Room were treated.

Conclusion: At present, the HSA cannot take an active stand over this important issue. It can, however, enlighten the communities and have community groups take a stand on the issue. HSA will wait until November 1st and then take a position. It will be interesting to see the outcome.


