Stay close to the ground--in ditches, hollows, or caves or lie flat in an open field.


If swimming or boating, get back to the shore fast. Sailors should avoid rigging and mast and try to get below deck.


HELPFUL HINTS by Bernie Wechsler

Having problems with rust stains from spray cans? There is a very easy way to prevent this. Cut $1\frac{1}{2}$ " of bicycle inner tube as shown in Fig. 1.

Stretch across the bottom of can. Fig. 2.

Bicycle inner tubes can be obtained free at your local bike shop - most shops discard them daily. One tube could last the average family for an entire year.

Discard entire can and strip when empty. Cut a new ring and place on full can.
