MAYOR CUTS SCHOOL CROSSING POSTS

Although funds were approved in the City expense budget last June for school crossing guards, Mayor Koch has decided to reallocate funds and eliminate many school crossing guard posts. Mrs. Alice Stapleton, who has so ably served our children for the past few years, is scheduled to be reassigned on October 17, 1980. On that date her present school crossing post, at the intersection of Commonwealth Blvd. and 87th Ave., will be eliminated. Hundreds of children from P.S. 133 and St. Gregory the Great grammar school will be forced to take their lives in their hands as they cross Commonwealth Blvd. to get to school.

The post is given a class B priority by the Police Department. All of the current class B crossings as well as three of the twenty-nine class A crossings in the 105th Precinct will lose their assigned crossing guards. It is expected that uniformed

police officers will be reassigned to cover the three class A crossings only.

There are no traffic control devices on Commonwealth Blvd. between Hillside Ave. and Jamaica Ave. That long uncontrolled stretch is conducive to speeding and creates a hazard for our children. The BCCA has gone on record in opposition to the elimination of the school crossing post.

It has been quite obvious to the observer that Bellerose has lost many of its large and beautiful trees. Plant disease, outward vandalism of bark, storms, root cuttings have all contributed to the disappearance of these works of nature. Home-

owners interested in having trees planted on their streets should get in touch with their local Community Boards (ours is CB 13) listed in the telephone book under New York City. states a recent item in the newspaper. It can. however, take up to a year to get a tree, and with budget cuts, future planting is uncertain.
