RIGHT TO VOTE

If you failed to vote in at least one General, Special or Primary Election during the two preceding calendar years (1980-1981) then you will have to re-register with the Queens Board of Elections to vote in the General Election Nov. 2. Call 392-8989 and ask for an Application for Registration and Enrollment by mail. If you will not be home on Nov. 2, you can vote by absentee ballot. Call 392-8989 and ask for an application for an absentee ballot.

A large voter turnout on election day will make all of the politicians take notice of the Bellerose Commonwealth Civic Association. With more political clout, the politicians will work harder for us.

Don't let someone else pick the candidates! Vote in the Primary Election on Sept. 23.

Reapportionment has affected Bellerose. We are now going to be in the 25th Assembly District starting Jan. 1983. We will now be represented by the 7th Congressional District.

At the BCCA Regular Meeting on Oct. 7, we will have our first Candidates Night. It will be non-partisan and we will invite candidates from all major political parties to come and answer questions. The list includes 16th District of City Council, Council at Large Queens, 25th Assembly District, 11th State Senate District and 7th Congressional District.

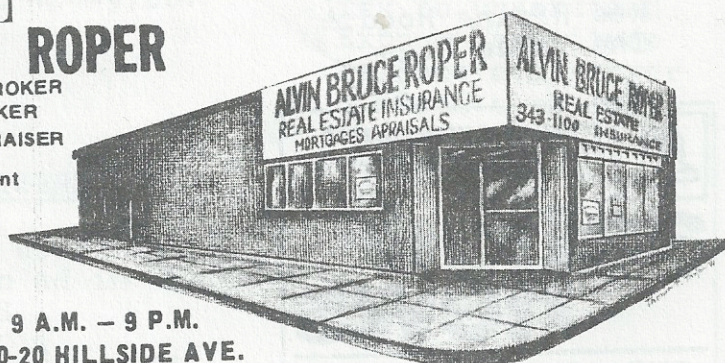

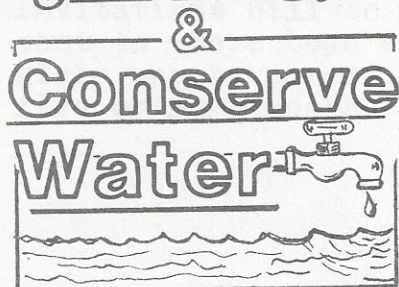
