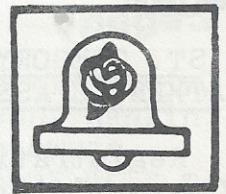

The author, although originally scheduled to make an appearance, was occupied with details of the filming of the movie version of his best-seller.

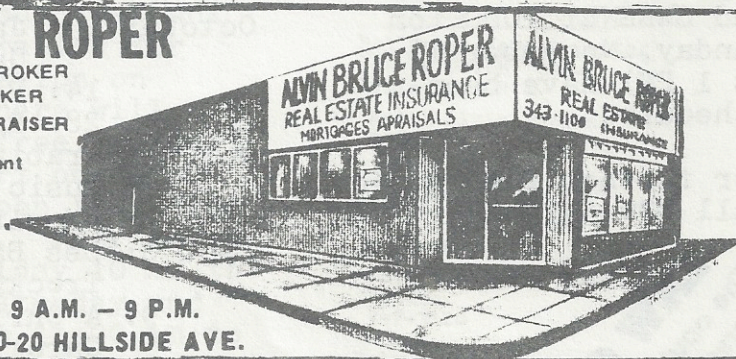
