

In addition, this project is the first of many contracts that the state and city will undertake in the next few years to upgrade the on- and off-ramps of the Cross Island Parkway to meet Federal specifications. This part of the project required some innovative

twenty years - it would finally get construction techniques as well as rid of the "Pigeon tunnel", for totalling re-landscaping the parkway rights-of-way. By driving sheeting and creating a whole new three lane parkway just west of the CIP, the State claims it will be able to maintain full speed for both directions of the CIP during removal of the Pigeon Tunnel.


