Hello Bellerose.

At the last BCCA board meeting the board approved another set of awards to a Class of '16 graduating boy and girl from St. Gregory school and PS133. They'll receive a certificate, letter and a check from BCCA in recognition of the students most involved as school citizens. The awards will be presented by a BCCA executive. At the general meeting we were very pleased to hear from the new commander of the 105th Precinct, Deputy Inspector Jeffrey Schiff. The DI just came from the Ozone Park/Howard Beach area but he spent much of his youth here in Bellerose/Glen Oaks so he is very familiar with our area. Crime is down 15%, although there have been some patterns of burglaries recently. Our XO, Capt. Ireland, also came to the meeting, she will focus on domestic violence and traffic safety in addition to supporting the DI in running the precinct. One of their initiatives is to greatly increase communications and they are working on building a large email list to get info out quickly. They have established an email ad-

dress to send immediate information about suspected criminal activity. We will let you know how to get listed on these new communication emails. 105precinct@nypd.org will be available shortly to receive crime info for investigation. The second speaker was Anthony Iuliano of the

City Buildings Department (DOB). We have been working with Anthony for many years. He explained the dual roles of DOB: to enforce the building code and zoning restrictions; and, to support development (ie. issue permits).

Sidewalk Violations, Street Trees and Curbs, Pruning

Community Board 13 recently asked representatives of the Parks Department and the Department of Transportation to speak about cracked, broken and raised sidewalks and what to do about violations. We all know that the homeowner is responsible for the repair and maintenance of sidewalks around their homes. Walking around Bellerose can be quite challenging in places, especially if you are pushing a child's stroller, wheelchair or if you have any mobility issues. Dangerous trip hazards abound and can be a major liability to the homeowner. Except for damage caused by street trees (trees in the grass area between the curb and sidewalk), the homeowner must repair cracked, broken or raised sidewalks. The Department of Transportation (DOT) is responsible to inspect sidewalks and may issue violations if they find or are called to a problem sidewalk. The homeowner has 45 days to repair and reinspect any violations or at some point a lien will be placed on the property. If that lien is not satisfied the sale or refinancing of the property may be impeded. The homeowner may hire a reputable concrete contractor, pull permits and have the completed job re-inspected, or eventually the city's contractor will do the job, including permits and inspections-and then bill the homeowner. The city's contractors will probably cost more. The homeowner may opt to pay extra for expedited service by DOT. In the event the sidewalk damage is caused by a city street tree, the city is responsible to repair the damage, but it can take a long time to get there. Please be sure to check www.nyc.gov/sidewalks for more information.

Curbs are the City's responsibility to repair and replace. The recent repaying in Bellerose left many curbs barely showing over the pavement. Curb repairs are severely underfunded.

It is the duty of City Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) to inspect street trees, prune them or remove the trees and stumps when necessary. Unmanaged trees can create a dangerous hazard during storms, such as Sandy. Pruning is necessary also to prevent damage to your house and wires, etc. Please call 311 to request pruning if a street tree is impacting your house. Unfortunately street tree pruning is another item that is routinely underfunded in the city's budgets. While each tree should be pruned every five years, it seems this schedule is rarely achieved. Overgrowth may contribute to dangerous conditions, particularly, when trees, limbs or branches fall during a storm. DPR says that its top priority is to remove blockages from city streets so that ambulances, fire trucks and police can get through. After that, damage to homes, buildings, yards, etc. will be addressed. When a street tree is to be removed, ropes and bucket trucks will be used by DPR or its contractors. Report any damage caused by crews that do not follow safe and proper procedures.

Trees that are removed for whatever reason will leave a stump. Supposedly, contracts over recent years require the crews to return and remove the stump. Unfortunately there is a serious backlog of previous stumps. BCCA on a number of occasions surveyed stumps in our area and submitted detailed lists to DPR for removal, but many still remain. The DPR representative suggested to report stumps to 311, but for stumps and pruning requests to also notify your community board, CB13Q—718-464-9700 with the 311 reference number. The rep also said that the fastest way to get a stump removed is to call 311 and request a new tree, new trees get priority.
